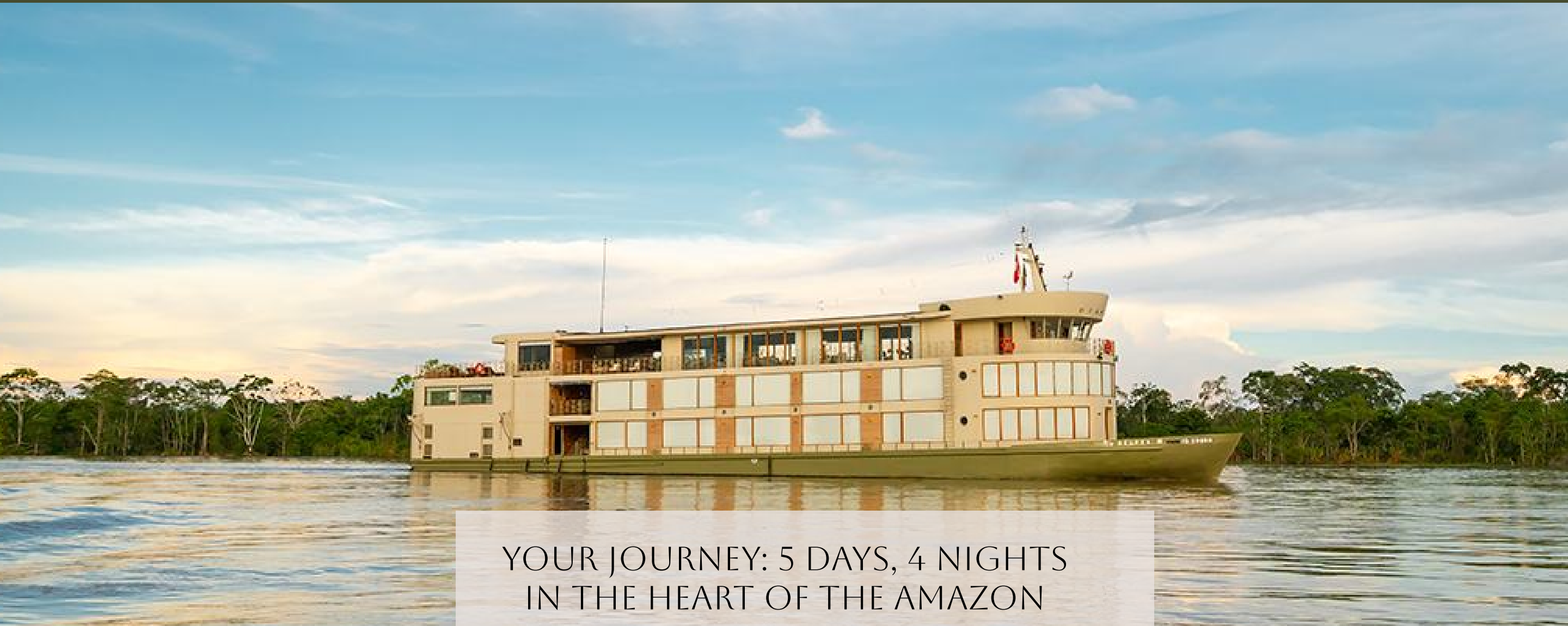




YOUR JOURNEY: 5 DAYS, 4 NIGHTS IN THE HEART OF THE AMAZON

DAY 1

● EMBARKATION & FIRST ENCOUNTERS

Your journey begins in Iquitos, a vibrant gateway city surrounded by jungle and water. Our team welcomes you at the airport and accompanies you in comfort aboard our private vehicle. As you journey toward Nauta, a nourishing lunchbox eases you into the rhythms of the rainforest.

In Nauta, one of the oldest towns in Loreto, you'll be greeted at our private embarkation port. Here begins your intimate encounter with the Amazon. Step aboard your Delfin vessel and settle into your suite—an oasis of calm crafted with local elegance, from handwoven details to natural cotton comforts and your own private terrace.

As the vessel glides into the waters of the Marañón River, join your naturalist guide in the observation lounge for an overview of the journey ahead—its landscapes, wildlife, history, and wonder.



DAY 2

● AWAKENING WATERS, WHISPERING RIVERS

Begin the day with a skiff excursion through Yanallpa, just before breakfast, as the rainforest holds the quiet mystery of dawn. At this magical hour, the river becomes a mirror for the first morning light, while birds and monkeys announce the forest's awakening in a chorus of life.

In the afternoon, we'll navigate toward the golden waters of the Río Dorado. Here, glide through calm channels by kayak or try your hand at piranha fishing in the warm afternoon sun. As night falls, a thrilling safari reveals the Amazon's hidden world—glowing eyes in the shadows, the rustle of wings, and the hush of the river under a starlit sky.



DAY 3

● AMONG DOLPHINS AND THE ROOTS OF THE EARTH

After breakfast, we'll venture into the majestic Pacaya River—one of the Amazon's hidden gems. Here, you'll have the chance to swim near the playful pink river dolphins, a truly unforgettable moment of connection with nature. We'll then visit an Amazonian riverside plaza, where the land offers a gift of its own: a rejuvenating mud treatment drawn from the river's mineral-rich bed.

In the afternoon, we'll continue our journey with a peaceful skiff exploration through Magdalena. As we glide along the water, you'll encounter more of the Amazon's incredible biodiversity—from elusive birds to medicinal plants—each discovery a window into the deep harmony of the rainforest.



DAY 4

● WHERE IT ALL BEGINS

We begin the day with a visit to a local community along the Yarapa River. Here, you'll meet the people who have lived in harmony with the jungle for generations, gaining insight into their traditions, daily life, and profound connection to the land. If you wish, we encourage you to bring donations—school supplies, lightweight clothing, or hygiene items are always appreciated.

Next, we'll journey to a place of deep significance: the Confluence. At this sacred meeting point, the Ucayali and Marañón Rivers merge to form the mighty Amazon River—the most powerful waterway on Earth. It's a humbling moment, witnessing the birthplace of a legend.

In the afternoon, we'll walk the forest trails of Fundo Casual. With our naturalist guides leading the way, you'll step once more into the jungle's embrace—soaking in its sounds, its scents, and its final whispered farewells.

DAY 5

● A FOND FAREWELL TO THE AMAZON

With warm hearts, our staff will bid you farewell as your journey comes to an end. At Nauta’s port, our team will escort you by private vehicle back to Iquitos, a scenic 95-kilometer drive.

Before your flight, enjoy an interactive activity about melipona stingless bees and their crucial role in the Amazon ecosystem. We’ll also visit the Amazon Research Center for Ornamental Fishes, where you can admire the Amazon’s vibrant aquatic life—from giant arapaima to colorful freshwater stingrays. This final stop offers a beautiful farewell to the region’s rich biodiversity.

Our team will assist with your luggage and check-in at Iquitos airport. At security, your guide and the Delfin crew will warmly say goodbye, hoping your Amazon journey leaves you with unforgettable memories.



BONUS TRACK

Once on board, your naturalist guide will introduce you to the enriching activities that await throughout your journey. From sunrise birdwatching to afternoon wildlife presentations, you’ll have the chance to taste exotic jungle fruits you’ve likely never encountered and even try your hand at preparing a traditional local dish.

Each experience is designed to draw you closer to the Amazon –its flavors, its rhythms, and its hidden wonders. With warmth and care, we invite you to take part in every moment, to learn, to feel, and to savor a little more of this extraordinary world.

ESSENCIAL NOTES:

During your journey, enjoy nature walks with waterproof boots and rain ponchos provided for your comfort, kayak sessions in calm waters guided by a naturalist (weather permitting), catch-and-release fishing, and meaningful visits to local communities where small gifts like T-shirts, school supplies, toys, or candies are warmly appreciated by the children.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Itineraries may change due to weather or river conditions, with excursions adjusted at the Delfin crew's discretion. Iquitos experiences warm, humid weather with temperatures ranging from 21°C to 33°C (70°F to 90°F). The rainy high-water season runs from January to June, and the dry low-water season from July to December, each bringing distinct changes in wildlife and landscape.

Pack light, breathable clothing, long sleeves, swimwear, soft-soled shoes, and bring layers like cardigans or wind-resistant jackets for cooler nights; waterproof boots and rain ponchos are provided.

To protect against insects, we recommend taking Vitamin B or B-15 before arrival, along with conventional repellents and bite creams. Don't forget sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a camera with extra batteries, we will give you binoculars per cabin.

All of our vessels have WIFI connection on the third deck, we will share the password one you are on board. Tips are customary but not included; about US\$ 320 per passenger is suggested, shared among the crew and guides, with envelopes provided in your cabin. We also recommend bringing around USD\$100 in small Soles denominations for purchases outside the main walk, especially at Fundo Casual, known for its beautiful wooden boards.
