DAY 1

● EMBARKATION & FIRST ENCOUNTERS

Your journey begins in Iquitos, a vibrant gateway city surrounded by jungle and water. Our team welcomes you at the airport and accompanies you in comfort aboard our private vehicle. As you journey toward Nauta, a nourishing lunchbox eases you into the rhythms of the rainforest.

In Nauta, one of the oldest towns in Loreto, you'll be greeted at our private embarkation port. Here begins your intimate encounter with the Amazon. Step aboard your Delfin vessel and settle into your suite—an oasis of calm crafted with local elegance, from handwoven details to natural cotton comforts and your own private terrace.

As the vessel glides into the waters of the Ucayali River, join your naturalist guide in the observation lounge for an overview of the journey ahead—its landscapes, wildlife, history, and wonder.

At twilight, set out on your first skiff excursion through the seasonally flooded forest. The high waters bring you closer to the treetops, where monkeys leap between branches and colorful birds perch just overhead. As the sun sets, the forest shifts into another world. Search for caimans, owls, and other nocturnal creatures under a starlit canopy. This is the Amazon in high water—immersive, thriving, unforgettable.



DAY 2

● SECRETS OF THE LIVING FOREST

This morning, explore the Yanallpa area with an early excursion through Belluda Caño, where the rainforest awakens in full splendor. As you navigate its calm waters, your guides will share insights about the Pacaya Samiria National Reserve, enriching your understanding of this extraordinary ecosystem.

In the afternoon, head toward the Río Dorado for an immersive exploration. Glide across its mirrored waters by kayak, surrounded by the flooded forest and the vibrant sounds of the Amazon, a rare and unforgettable perspective of the rainforest.

As night falls, return to Río Dorado for a nocturnal excursion. Under the glow of the moon and the careful guidance of your naturalist, discover the hidden world of creatures that emerge after dark, revealing the mystical side of the Amazon.

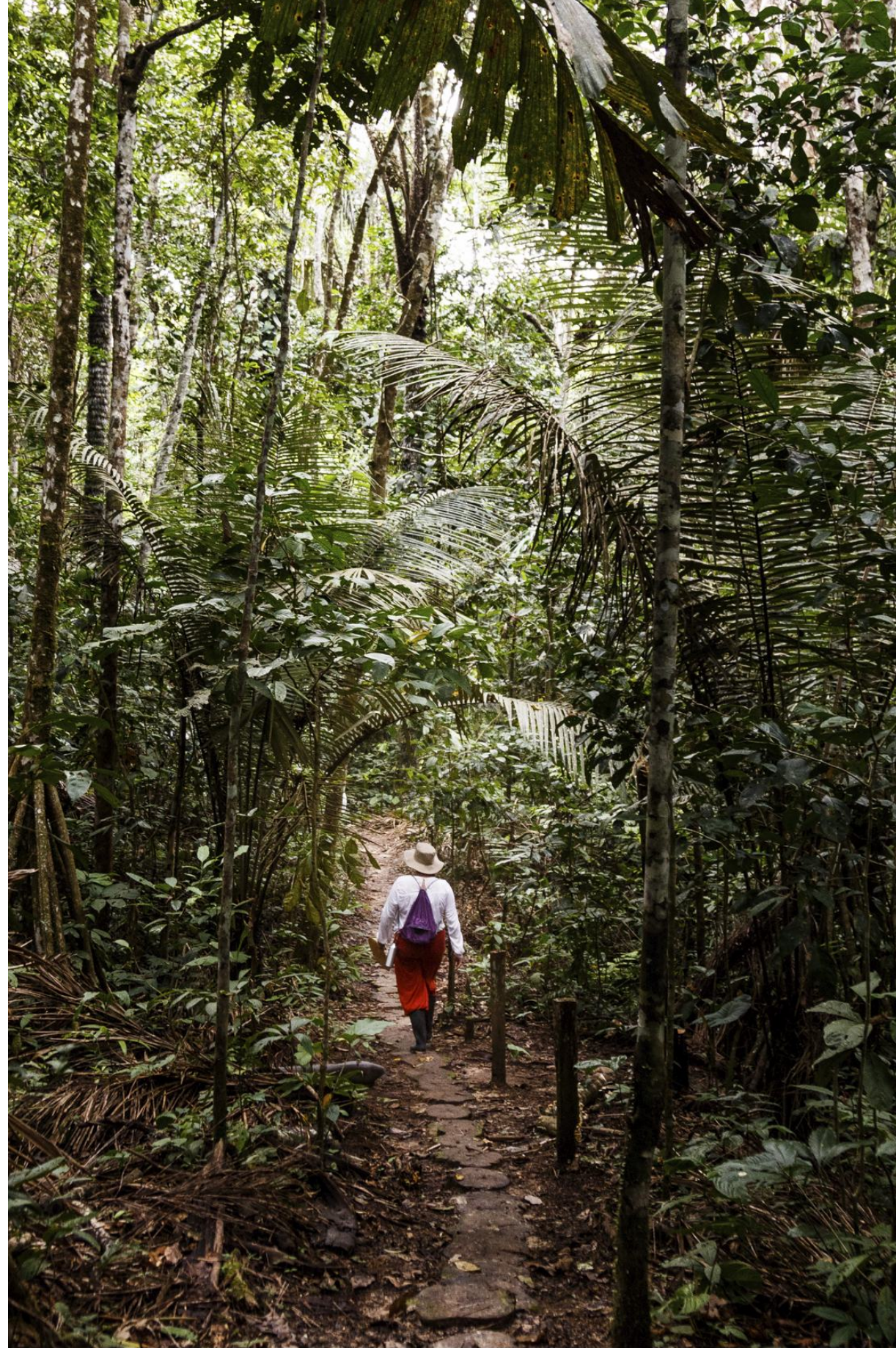


DAY 3

● JOURNEYS THROUGH THE AMAZON

This morning, venture into the pristine waters of the Pacaya River, one of the most protected areas within the Pacaya Samiria National Reserve. After a skiff exploration through this remarkable landscape, enjoy a breakfast served aboard the skiff, surrounded by the sights and sounds of the Amazon, an unforgettable dining experience in the heart of the rainforest.

In the afternoon, continue your journey to Magdalena for a guided skiff exploration in search of the Amazon's extraordinary wildlife. Keep watch for monkeys, sloths, colorful birdlife, caimans, and, with a bit of luck, the iconic pink river dolphins in their natural habitat. Accompanied by your naturalist guide, this excursion offers a deeper connection to one of the most biodiverse ecosystems on Earth.



DAY 4

● WHERE RIVERS AND LIVES MEET

Begin your morning exploring the Yarapa River, where the calm waters and awakening rainforest create the perfect setting for wildlife spotting. Continue toward the Confluence, where two powerful tributaries meet an inspiring moment that showcases the grandeur of the Amazon.

Later in the morning, visit a local riverside community, either Amazonas or San Francisco. Here, you'll learn about daily life along the river, from long-held traditions to the close relationship families maintain with their natural surroundings.

In the afternoon, venture into Fundo Casual for a guided rainforest walk. As you move beneath the towering canopy, your naturalist will reveal the hidden wonders of the Amazon, from unique flora to the wildlife that thrives within this vibrant ecosystem.



DAY 5

● A FOND FAREWELL TO THE AMAZON

With warm hearts, our staff will bid you farewell as your journey comes to an end. At Nauta’s port, our team will escort you by private vehicle back to Iquitos, a scenic 95-kilometer drive.

Before your flight, enjoy an interactive activity about melipona stingless bees and their crucial role in the Amazon ecosystem. We’ll also visit the Amazon Research Center for Ornamental Fishes, where you can admire the Amazon’s vibrant aquatic life—from giant arapaima to colorful freshwater stingrays. This final stop offers a beautiful farewell to the region’s rich biodiversity.

Our team will assist with your luggage and check-in at Iquitos airport. At security, your guide and the Delfin crew will warmly say goodbye, hoping your Amazon journey leaves you with unforgettable memories.



BONUS TRACK

Once on board, your naturalist guide will introduce you to the enriching activities that await throughout your journey. From sunrise birdwatching to afternoon wildlife presentations, you’ll have the chance to taste exotic jungle fruits you’ve likely never encountered and even try your hand at preparing a traditional local dish.

Each experience is designed to draw you closer to the Amazon—its flavors, its rhythms, and its hidden wonders. With warmth and care, we invite you to take part in every moment, to learn, to feel, and to savor a little more of this extraordinary world.

ESSENCIAL NOTES:

During your journey, enjoy nature walks with waterproof boots and rain ponchos provided for your comfort, kayak sessions in calm waters guided by a naturalist (weather permitting), catch-and-release fishing, and meaningful visits to local communities where small gifts like T-shirts, school supplies, toys, or candies are warmly appreciated by the children.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Itineraries may change due to weather or river conditions, with excursions adjusted at the Delfin crew's discretion. Iquitos experiences warm, humid weather with temperatures ranging from 21°C to 33°C (70°F to 90°F). The rainy high-water season runs from November to June, and the dry low-water season from June to November, each bringing distinct changes in wildlife and landscape.

Pack light, breathable clothing, long sleeves, swimwear, soft-soled shoes, and bring layers like cardigans or wind-resistant jackets for cooler nights; waterproof boots and rain ponchos are provided.

To protect against insects, we recommend taking Vitamin B or B-15 before arrival, along with conventional repellents and bite creams. Don't forget sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, and a camera with extra batteries, we will give you binoculars per cabin.

All of our vessels have WIFI connection on the third deck, we will share the password once you are on board. Tips are customary but not included; about US\$ 320 per passenger is suggested, shared among the crew and guides, with envelopes provided in your cabin. We also recommend bringing around USD\$100 in small Soles denominations for purchases outside the main walk, especially at Fundo Casual, known for its beautiful wooden boards.
